# **TOP TEN GRAVEL DRIVERS**



### I GUY WILKS

Nobody in the British Rally
Championship could get near
Wilks on the Pirelli International or
Rally GB this year. He won every
gravel round of the BRC. He took
his first outright International rally
win on his first time driving a Group
N car competitively on the Pirelli.

# **2 MARK HIGGINS**

The former British champion had problems keeping up with the Mitsubishi on the BRC, but did an amazing job given that his car just wasn't on the same level.

#### 3 MARCUS DODD

Well, he did win the MSA Gravel championship. Dodd won all but two of the rounds this year to take



his third title in convincing fashion, driving for his own HPM team.

#### **4 ANDY BURTON**

Although he doesn't tend to register for a championship, Burton claimed a string of dominant wins on ANCRO and BTRDA events in his Peugeot-Cosworth, thrilling rally fans in the process.

### **5 STEVE PEREZ**

Took two top scores in the Gravel championship and took his long overdue first National A win on the Border Counties in March. Also impressed in a historic car on the East African Safari Classic.

# **6 PHILLIP MORROW**

The new Evo Challenge champion showed his worth on gravel taking top marks on all the forest rounds of the series. He is aiming to compete in the Irish Tarmac championship next year to extend his knowledge of that surface.

### **7 KRIS HALL**

Aged only 18, Hall won the highly competitive 205 Challenge one-make series with a round to spare. The budget series has produced some great drivers, and Hall looks likely to follow in that line.

### 8 GRAHAM MIDDLETON

The former BTRDA Gold star champion returned this year to take the Silver Star crown. He even found time to contest Baja GB, which he initially led.

# 9 JOCK ARMSTRONG

After a ten year absence from the sport, Armstrong won Group N in the Gravel championship and the Subaru Cup. He will be back for more in 2008.

#### IO ALICK KERR

The talented Scottish youngster was a clear winner of the competitive 205 Ecosse Challenge. He also won a free entry to the Tour of Mull by winning the John Easson Scholarship.
